ACHIEVEMENTS

- UNIDO and the Directorate of Industrial Training (DIT) have agreed on the new dates and modalities of the first fully digital Assessment and Training Package (ATP) workshop in the history of Uganda. ATP development panel members were selected and invited for the ATP workshop in early August.
- Several motor grader operators from the National Enterprise Cooperation (NEC) completed the eLearning modules for the Komatsu GD663-A2 motor grader.
- UNIDO and the Permanent Mission of Japan to the International Organizations in Vienna co-organized an online event titled 'Partnering for ISID: New challenges and opportunities for the UNIDO-Japan cooperation,' including a webinar on July 1 on 'Joining forces for industrial skills development' that also featured METRAC. A CSR representative from Komatsu Ltd. was invited as a speaker on the panel.
- 3 Komatsu WorksiteVR Simulators (1 wheel loader and 2 excavator simulators) donated by Komatsu Ltd. were delivered to Kampala.
- UNIDO received feedback on the proposed heavy equipment operations textbook for the training of the 50 MoWT trainers from MoWT and Komatsu Ltd.

PLANNED ACTIVITIES IN AUGUST 2021

- From August 2 to 6, DIT as the responsible curriculum development authority under the Ministry of Education and Sports (MoES) will conduct a 5-day ATP workshop. The workshop will form the basis for an ATP for road construction equipment operator trainers at level 4 of the Uganda Vocational Qualification Framework (UVQF). This ATP will serve as a curriculum outline and assessment basis for the training of the 50 MoWT trainers undertaken by METRAC.
- UNIDO will officially hand over the Komatsu WorksiteVR Simulators to MoWT as soon as the lockdown regulations permit.
