We support investment from mainly three sectors:

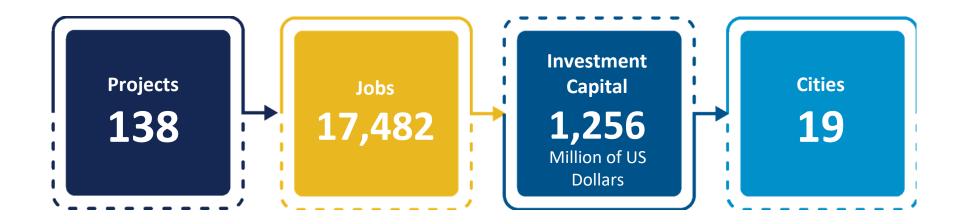

Colombia is the **43rd largest** economy in the world and the **4**th in Latin America (World Bank).



Colombia will grow 7.6% in 2021 above the expected growth for Latin America and the Caribbean (5.2%) (OECD, 2021).



Colombia has **FTA with +60 countries:** U.S.A., European Union, Pacific Alliance, Mercosur, CARICOM.

Colombia is the 2nd best country in the policy continuity index for South America (STPRI, Fitch Solutions).

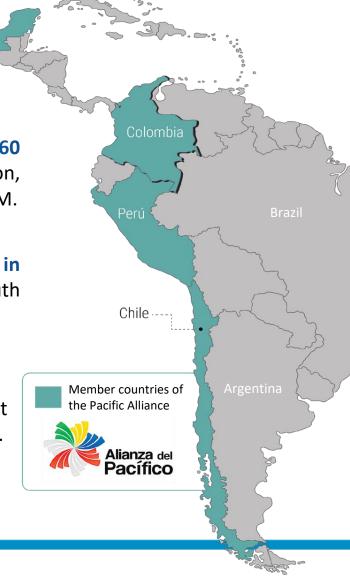

VALLE DEL CAUCA AT A GLANCE



It accounts for 10% of Colombian GDP, with an average growth of 3.2% in the last five years¹.



With only 1.9% of the national territory, it concentrates 18% of the national industry and 21% of the agroindustry³.



Colombia's main port in the Pacific Ocean accounts for 41% of national foreign trade⁴.



The region has a network of 7 intermediate cities with populations between 100,000 and 400,000 inhabitants².

Investment opportunities – Nearshoring



Using HJS's methodology to analyze U.S. and China foreign trade, Invest Pacific set out to find what were the best investment opportunities for Asian companies in Colombia in a nearshoring environment with the U.S. market.



The FTA between Colombia and the U.S. is the best FTA that the U.S. has with any country in the region. It grants 0% tariffs in practically all the exportable goods under very softened origin rules that demand, on average, 35%-45% of local added value in the final product.

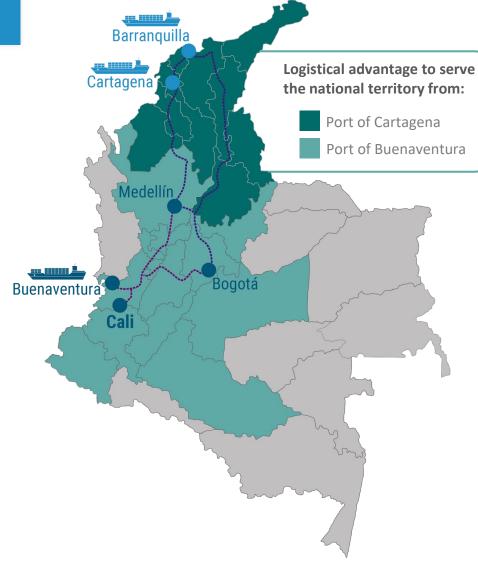
Valle del Cauca is the best location to attend the local market.

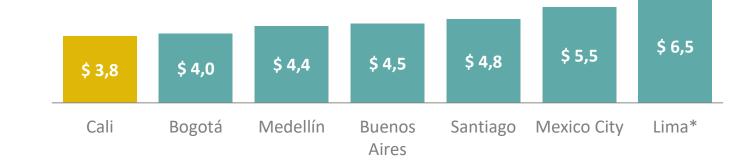
Tax and Tariff Benefits

- 20% of income tax in the Free Trade Zone, compared to 32% nationwide.
- No tariffs or VAT are caused on goods and infrastructure while they remain in the free zone.
- Purchases made outside of the FTZ framed within corporate purpose of the FTZ companies are exempt from VAT.
- The goods produced in the FTZ acquire Colombian origin for Free Trade Agreements benefits purpose.
- Possibility of **nationalizing raw materials or the final product** when the goods are going to be sold in the rest of the country.

OPERATING COSTS— REAL ESTATE

• Warehouse average lease price (\$USD/m²) in the main cities of Latin America (4Q 2020)

Cali offers the more competitive costs, in average 20% cheaper than the major industrial nodes in Latin America.

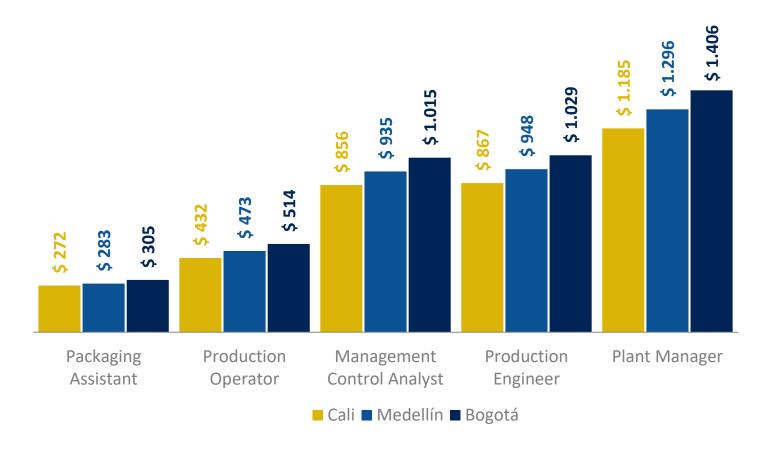


Hourly average wage in the manufacturing sector (USD/hour)

The manufacturing hourly wage in Colombia is 37% lower than in Mexico and 41% lower than in Brazil, the main industrial locations in Latin America.



OPERATING COSTS— SALARIES FOR INDUSTRY KEY POSITIONS



Monthly Average Salaries (\$USD) in the main cities of Colombia for key positions of the industrial sector in 2021:

 Cali has salaries at least 16% more competitive than in other main cities in Colombia for production operators.

The surcharge payment over the basic salary is 38.4% in average for salaries up to 10 minimum monthly wages*.

Main Success Stories



Hero MotoCorp established its first out-sideof-India motorcycle assembly plant in the region in 2014 with the purpose of supplying the domestic market and exporting to the Andean region.



Furukawa Group has a **fiber optic cable production plant** in Valle del Cauca which supplies the Andean region, Central America and Mexico.



Essel Group, global leader in the production of collapsible packaging and containers has a manufacturing plant in the region from where they supply the pharmaceutical, cosmetic, and food industries and export to all Latin American countries.



LG established a logistics complex and distribution center in Palmira, Valle del Cauca in 2017, from where they distribute electronic equipment & household appliances to the main cities in Colombia.



Sumitomo Chemical entered the region with the **acquisition of Nufarm subsidiaries** in all South America in 2020 from where they continue to grow in the fertilizers sector.



World leader in the **production of rigid packaging**, Amcor has a history of +15 years in the region from where they have expanded their production facilities continuously to meet the growing demand for packaging in Colombia.
