

About UNIDO

UNIDO (United Nations Industrial Development Organization) was established in 1966 as an autonomous body within the United Nations, and was converted into a specialized agency in 1985. With a mission to achieve "Inclusive and Sustainable Industrial Development" (ISID), UNIDO promotes industrial development for poverty reduction, inclusive globalization and environmental sustainability



About UNIDO ITPO Tokyo

UNIDO's Investment and Technology Promotion Office (ITPO) in Tokyo was established in March 1981 based on an agreement between UNIDO and the Government of Japan. The mission of UNIDO ITPO Tokyo is to help developing countries in their efforts to achieve inclusive and sustainable industrial development by promoting foreign direct investment and technology transfer from Japan through various activities.

The UNIDO Network

UNIDO is headquartered in Vienna, Austria and has 3 Liaison offices in Brussels, Geneva and New York. There are 48 offices (19 in Africa, 7 in the Middle East and North Africa, 12 in Asia and the Pacific, 3 in Europe and Central Asia, and 7 in Latin America and the Caribbean), including field offices and regional offices covering 156 countries, as well as Investment and Technology Transfer Promotion Offices (ITPOs) in 9 locations in 8 countries including ITPO Tokyo.



UNIDO ITPO Tokyo's Activities

UNIDO ITPO Tokyo promotes investments and technology transfer from Japan to developing and emerging countries through five main activities: (1) Delegate Programme (inviting investment and technology promotion officers), (2) Technology Transfer, (3) Seminars and Events, (4) Capacity Building (programme for embassies in Japan), and (5) Activities Overseas. In addition, we promote our activities through our website, PR magazine, press releases, and annual reports.

Delegate Programme

UNIDO ITPO Tokyo promotes investment and technology transfer from Japan to developing and emerging countries, by organizing individual meetings and promotion events together with representatives of Investment Promotion Agencies. Investment or technology promotion delegates are invited for a short-term stay in Japan, to promote their countries as possible destinations for Japanese investments and technology transfers. In 2021, investment officers from 6 countries participated in the programme and 64 business meetings were held between the investment officers and Japanese companies. In 2021, all the programmes were organized online.

Technology Transfer

UNIDO ITPO Tokyo promotes selected sound, productive, and sustainable technologies and the know-how of Japanese companies seeking partners overseas, in order to assist inclusive and sustainable development efforts worldwide. The Sustainable Technology Promotion Platform (STePP) operated by UNIDO ITPO Tokyo promotes technology transfer to developing and emerging countries by registering, disseminating, and sharing information on Japanese technologies related to energy, environment, agribusiness, human health and disaster countermeasures. As of March 2022, 113 companies have registered 130 technologies in the STePP.



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Seminars & Events

In cooperation with government agencies and investmentrelated organizations in developing and emerging countries, UNIDO ITPO Tokyo conducts seminars and events for Japanese companies on investment and technology transfer, specializing in various themes in a wide range of countries, regions, and fields. In 2021, many of the seminars were held online, and we hosted/co-hosted 42 events with approximately 6,000 participants.

Capacity Building

Capacity Building activities help foster the organizational ability of developing and emerging countries to promote industrial development. UNIDO ITPO Tokyo organizes capacity-building activities such as lectures and visits to factories and exhibitions, as well as fact-finding meetings for various delegations from developing countries and for embassy officials in Japan. In 2021, two virtual study tours were conducted, with 44 participants. They learned about technologies related to energy, recycling, IoT, etc. from Japanese companies.



Activities Overseas

UNIDO ITPO Tokyo facilitates the business activities of Japanese companies overseas through a network of UNIDO, government and private sector contacts in developing and emerging countries, as well as through the Africa Advisory Programme. In particular, four experienced local advisors based in Algeria, Ethiopia, Mozambique and Senegal support and advise Japanese companies considering business in Africa by arranging meetings with local government agencies, matching them with local partners, and facilitating visits to local companies. In 2021, we assisted 63 Japanese companies, some of which succeeded in concluding business contracts with local partners or establishing liaison offices.
