Output 1. DEVELOPING COMPETENCY-BASED AND DEMAND DRIVEN CURRICULUM



Two technical workshops took place at The National Council for Technical, Vocational and Other Academic Awards (NCTVA) on the 5th, 6th and 7th and 12th, 13th and 14th of September for the development of National Automotive Curriculum. We have successfully finalized Unit Standards ranging from level one to level five. Additionally, we have reached an agreement with NCTVA management regarding the logistical aspects for the consultation phase of curriculum development.

Output 2. ESTABLISHING A CENTER OF EXCELLENCE FOR AUTOMOTIVE TECHNICIAN TRAINING



Four automotive experts from the Government Technical Institute (GTI) Kisumu successfully completed a six-week Training of Trainers (ToT) program at the West African Vehicle Academy (WAVA) located in Accra, Ghana. During this program, the four experts from GTI underwent intensive training in six distinct areas, including "Vehicle Dynamics," "Diesel Injection," two levels of "Engine Management", "Drivetrain," and "Sensor and Car Network Systems".



All logistical arrangements have been completed for the four automotive experts from GTI Kisumu to attend a four weeks ToT at Toyota Kenya Academy in Nairobi, Kenya starting 9th of October 2023.
